The EYP is a non-partisan and independent programme. Its methods are based on non-formal education and peer-to-peer learning. Thereby the programme facilitates the learn-

ing of crucial social and professional skills, and encourages independent thinking and socio-political initiative.

The EYP is a pan-European organisation which does not limit itself to the current political borders of the European Union. As a network of independent associations, EYP is currently present in 39 European countries, enabling contacts across borders and beyond frontiers. The EYP thus offers a platform for intercultural meetings, fosters mutual understanding and makes a vital contribution towards the uniting of Europe.

Foreword

Dear members of EYP Switzerland,

We kicked the year off with a round of four Regional Sessions, taking place in Bern, Basel, Aarau and Geneva. We welcomed a record number of delegates this year, including several new schools and areas that we were able to reach through new outreach strategies. I see great development potential for our National Committee in this area. Reaching out allows us to diversify our members base, leading to more innovative and creative ideas and solutions.

The National Selection Conference was held in Lausanne and exceeded expectations in many ways. We were greatly humbled by the amount of people who were willing to contribute to this project, which was mirrored in the high amount of applications received.

With a theme focused on innovation the organising team was able to put together an impressive program. They managed to gather support from highly respectable individuals and institutions as well as hosted various events in very impressive venues. As always, the National Selection Conference was also the ideal setting to touch base with some of our most important members, our teachers. We held an intensive workshop, gathering feedback and input on how to make our organisation more accustomed to the needs of schools and teachers.

Finally, the engine is running hot on the final preparations for the First International Forum of EYP Switzerland which will be held in Basel this Spring. From an innovative academic concept to outstanding organisational efforts, this session promises to be a full success across the board. We hope to see many of you present at the alumni event!

Besides our annual sessions, we organised several events throughout the year of both social and academic quality. We were especially pleased to welcome such a high number of our members, both old and new, at the alumni weekend.

The first year of our third decade of existence seemingly passed by in a flash. Besides running the events of our organisation we were able to make significant progress in the expansion of our network, gathering increased support from third parties, whose affirmation of our work we value very deeply. Whilst we spend our anniversary year looking back on our history, we spent 2017 looking forward. We identified new areas of development potential and revisited old strategies, adapting them to our current needs. I am confident that 2018 will bring many great things for EYP Switzerland. Fresh minds and innovations will come together to bring us one step further in our development. I am convinced that our organisation holds an endless potential embodied in its members. Time and time again I am deeply impressed by the dedication and motivation displayed in our members base and I look forward to following our success story far into the future.

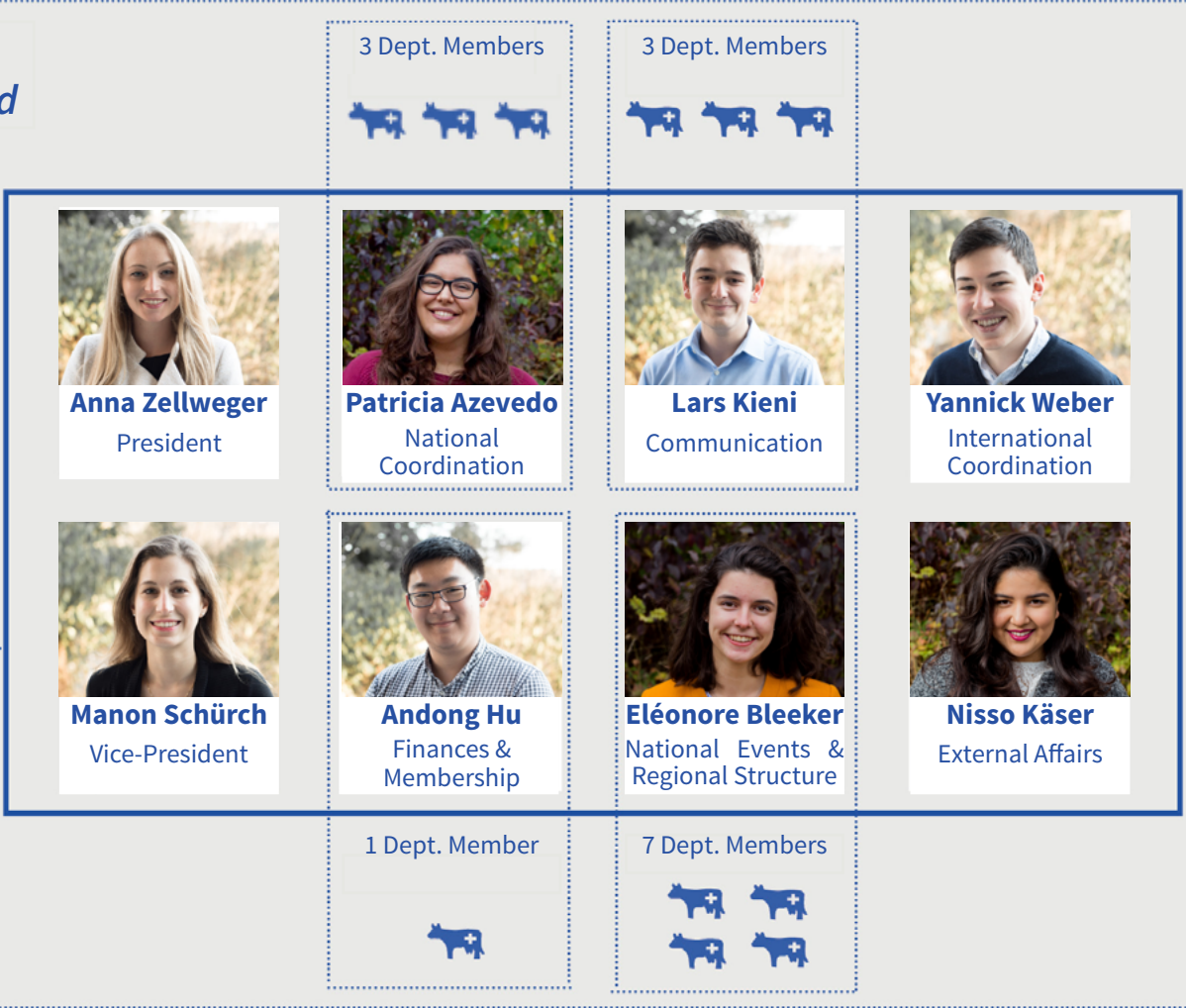

International Coordination

Part of a network spanning geographical Europe and beyond, EYP Switzerland is one of 40 National Committees (NCs) of the European Youth Parliament. The International Coordinator works to administer our ties to this diverse network in the realms of governance, policy, knowledge sharing, and exchange.

As one of the most active National Committees on an international level, EYP Switzerland continuously strives to contribute to shaping the future development of our organisation on the European level. At the Board of National Committees, the bi-annual assembly of representatives of all NCs in Berlin, EYP Switzerland was present and advocated its views on the future development of the network, especially on the international governance structure, policies adopted on the level of the network, and the future conception of International Sessions.

More and more of our Members avail themselves of the opportunity in EYP to go abroad: At our NSC Lausanne 2017, we could offer 70 delegate spots at foreign sessions and send many of our NSC delegates abroad to represent EYP Switzerland at events taking place all over Europe. Furthermore, throughout the whole year, 40 alumni went abroad to fill 115 officials positions at sessions in other NCs.

National Coordination

Being in charge of the National Coordination means taking on various responsibilities going from delegates administration for our annual sessions to schools relations and even alumni involvement. In 2017, four alumni joined the department as members with two of them focusing on schools and teacher relations and the two other ones working on administrative tasks and communication with the delegates. This new roles assured a clear structure within the department and assured a more efficient work.

The NSC Lausanne 2017 received a record number of applications from 46 different delegations. The application process was very competitive and the selection panel was intrigued by the quality of the applications received. 39 delegations were selected to attend the NSC based on predefined criteria regarding quality of the application and regional diversity.

An interesting and diverse programme was organised by the organisers for the chaperones of the attending delegations, concluding in a teacher's workshop and feedback session. Lausanne 2017 and EYP Switzerland received positive feedback, but the present teachers also suggested improvements, such as the need for more time at sessions for cultural activities and designated teachers for each NSC to take over the teachers programme as opposed to organisers..

Schools are EYP Switzerland's most important stakeholder. This has been mirrored in the revised communication and outreach strategy of EYP Switzerland.

A newsletter aimed at our active network of teachers and schools has been established. The first edition was sent out back in November 2016 and featured experiences of an EYP teacher accompanying her delegation to an International Forum in Georgia, an update from the organising team of the NSC Lausanne 2017, and useful information on our upcoming Regionals 2017.

Outreach to new schools is still based on our last year implemented two-staged approach. First, over 200 high schools and vocational schools received a redesigned promotion letter that introduces EYP Switzerland and our Sessions. Secondly, the Head Organisers got in touch with selected schools and encouraged students to register for one of the four Regional Sessions. The success of this strategy is already visible now: We've received a record number of registrations for our Regionals 2018, including many delegations from schools that never attended an EYP event before. 2018 is shaping up to becoming a very promising year of the department of National Coordination and EYP Switzerland.

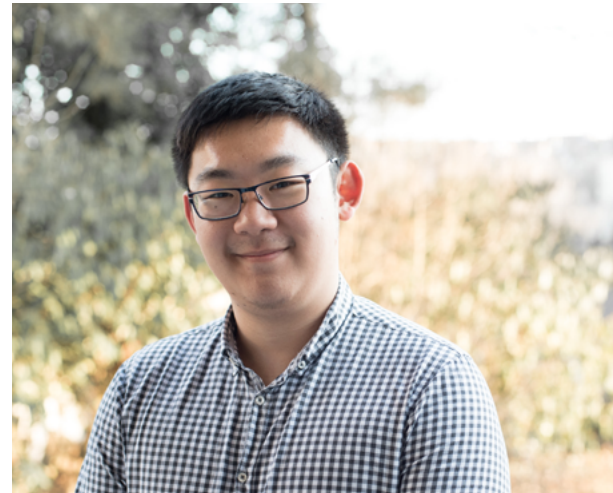
National Events & Regional Structure

For the fourth time, EYP Switzerland was fortunate enough to hold its round of Regional Sessions, each lasting for two days for delegates. While Basel, Bern and Geneva have established themselves as regular host cities, the Eastern region was hosted by the city of Aarau. Led by seven experienced Head Organisers, all four sessions were visited by a combined total of 300 delegates which is a new record number. Under the professional guidance of the Head Organisers of the four sessions, its organisers held up the high standard EYP Switzerland expects from its organising committees from an organisational viewpoint. The sessions were presided by Liora Lemberg from Estonia, Nina Thomic from Austria, Despina Dimitrakopoulou from Greece and Tuusa Eriksson from Finland. The maximum number 320 of delegates the four Regional Sessions are able to hold, was not reached, nevertheless, a record number of delegates later signed up to the NSC held in Lausanne. With a record number of official applications, every session was able to offer around 8 mostly first-time chairpersons and 2 vice-presidents a spot each. Out of the large pool of applicants, the selection panel was therefore able to select the most qualified candidates only which led to an increase in academic excellency during all sessions.

For the third time, EYP Switzerland held its annual chairs' training, this year in Bern which also marked our annual general meeting (AGM) where the board of EYP Switzerland for 2017 was elected. The chairs training was led by Isa Cantalapiedra from Spain and enabled a valuable first insight into chairing for many of our alumni. Our annual summer barbecue this year took place at the lakeside in Geneva for the first time with lovely weather.

For the fourth time, we held our annual Alumni Weekend - this time in Bern again - where lots of NSC Lausanne delegates got the chance to reunite. Several workshops were offered to our alumni, amongst them a chairs training and a strategy workshop where all participants got the chance to shape the future of EYP Switzerland by working on sustainable projects and had their own say on the shape and working methods of EYP Switzerland. While EYP introduction trainings were offered to our alumni, the annual HO summit was held at the same time where all Regional Session and National Selection Conference Head Organisers were trained by some of our most experienced alumni. We were especially fortunate to welcome Tom Wolfskämpf from Germany and Judit Lladós from Spain as our international trainers. The last event of the year took place in Zurich where EYP Switzerland celebrated its annual Christmas party at a nice restaurant, followed by mulled wine at the Christmas market. The Christmas party marks a successful end to a successful 21st year of EYP Switzerland.

Last but not least, the portfolio on National Events & Regional Structure in 2018 will undergo a massive change as the portfolio will be split between two board members as the workload has become too much to handle for one person seeing that our Regional Sessions get bigger and better every year. The close-knit relationship and collaboration between the Board and the Regional Session Head Organisers has grown stronger over the years and needs more oversight, the bigger the sessions get. Therefore, the responsibility of our National Events will as of 2018 be paired up with the competences of the Alumni Officer, in order to have one Board member who can fully commit to be available to our alumni and our training and social events.

Finances & Membership

Participation fees for both the regionals and the NSC this year has been for the first time ever, paid in majority by delegations instead of individual participants. This has helped us create a better overview and granted us more control over the flow of money. Goal for next year would be to encourage more teachers from the German speaking areas to do the same.

The NSC has been, for the first time ever, given a separate bank account at Postfinance, registered as a junior account to the EYP CH, giving the HOs of the NSC freedom over their own funding while the President of EYP CH as well as the Treasurer still retaining the overview. Taking feedbacks from the HOs, there should be more than one bank card for the NSC account next year as the HOs often need to buy multiple things during the session and having one bank cards limit their flexibility.

Finally, on the membership front, a new coordinated project was started together with National Coordination and Regional Structure to merge the many existing databases scattered all around Google Drive into one containing information such as Alumni names, email, birthdate and most importantly, this database will include informations on their swiss session history. This will help our registration in the long run and it is expected to be finished by the AGM.

External Affairs

2017 has been another successful year with respect to our external affairs. This year, we were able to welcome some highly renowned guest speakers and patrons to our sessions and secure more funding than we would have hoped for. We are very grateful for the work and dedication of Moritz Bondeli who stepped down from his position in October during the Extraordinary General Meeting of EYP Switzerland.

At our 21st National Selection Conference in Lausanne, we had the honor to have worked under the patronage of Mr Alain Berset, President of the Confederation; Mr Thomas Back, President of the International Olympic Committee; Mr Patrick Aeberscher, former President of the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Lausanne and Mr Raphaël Domjan, founder of the SolarStratos project. With his speech at the opening ceremony, Mr Domjan illustrated at best the general theme of the session, « Building tomorrow with today's innovation ». Our patrons are really important, not only because they allow us to be seen as a truly professional and qualified organisation but also because they encourage our alumni to stay engaged in the political process and to be a driving force for social progress.

In 2017, we also began a new partnership with Foraus, the think tank of foreign policy : indeed, all our members can now benefit from 50% off their Foraus membership fee!

Moreover, thanks to the long standing partnership with Movetia and a number of new supporting institutions such as OFAS and Loterie Romande, our events are well funded. The travel reimbursements granted to all of our NSC officials permits us to welcome truly motivated and hard working participants, despite their economical background. These funds also leave space for organizing teams to develop creative ideas on how to improve the session experiences of delegates and officials alike.

Now that we enter 2018, it is time to really concentrate on the next milestones for our organisation. The next goals will be to work on the long term partnerships that will strengthen EYP Switzerland's financial position and facilitate the efforts of the National Committee. Being able to reach more media is also a major point: is it our aim to make EYP known by every citizen as a great non formal education platform which permits youngsters to really develop their critical mind.

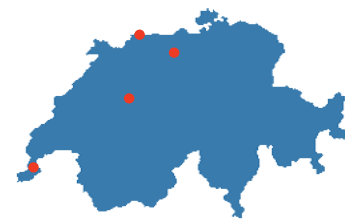

For the fourth time, EYP Switzerland was fortunate enough to hold its round of Regional Sessions, each lasting for two days for delegates. While Basel, Bern and Geneva have established themselves as regular host cities, the Eastern region was hosted by the city of Aarau. Led by seven experienced Head Organisers, all four sessions were visited by a combined total of 300 delegates precisely.

Under the professional guidance of the Head Organisers of the four sessions, its organisers held up the high standard EYP Switzerland expects from its organising committees from an organisational viewpoint. The sessions were led by Vivienne Heinzelmänn & Marsel Szopinski in Bern, Miriam Aitken & Lucius Miller in Basel, Aurel Gautschi in Aarau and Mallorie Ashton-Lomax & Solène Hababou in Geneva. They have all managed to add a special something to each individual session which clearly showed their dedication and appreciation for EYP Switzerland. We would like to sincerely thank all of them and their organising committees for their outstanding and hard work.

The maximum number 320 of delegates the four Regional Sessions are able to hold, was not reached, nevertheless, a record number of delegates later signed up to the NSC held in Lausanne. With a record number of more than 100 officials applications, every session was able to offer 7-8 mostly first-time chairpersons and 2 vice-presidents a spot each, as every committee would be single chaired.

There were no official journalists at any of the four sessions; however, this proved a fantastic opportunity for our newest and most promising alumni to take up an informal journalist role by assisting the editors with taking pictures and videos, as well as briefly involving them in other projects. This successful outcome led to the Alumni Officer Kate Gurevich this year for the second time implementing her officials' outreach project, all selected editors and Head Organisers which involves her inviting 1-2 promising EYP alumni per session who at one time have voiced their interest in taking up a role in an EYP media team. Since the idea of having a media team consisting not only of editors but also journalists was well-received by many of our alumni, the Board of EYP Switzerland decided to implement a full media team which involves an official call for journalists, starting in 2018.

For the second time, every committee at the Regional Sessions of EYP Switzerland were not co-chaired but chaired by one single chairperson. Out of the large pool of applicants, the selection panel was therefore able to select the most qualified candidates only which led to an increase in academic excellence during all sessions. Therefore, also continuing in 2018, the board decided on keeping the improved system thus securing our future first-time delegates with the best possible guidance.
